- What is the name of my new school and where is it?




Literacy


In phonics, the children are continuing to learn the letters of the alphabet and special friends (two letters making one sound)

The children are also learning to listen to the sounds in words and blend the sounds together. This will help them with their future reading.

Maths

In maths, we will be learning about





- What number comes next?
- What number comes before?
- Numbers to 5
- Subitising (looking at quantities from 1-3 and saying how many there are without counting)

Reading

We want all our nursery children to become super readers!

Just a reminder that children need to read their book at home to an adult at least four times a week.

All children need to also practise their letter cards at home.

We shall continue with our library sessions every Friday.

Please read every night with your child and sign their diary

RE

In our RE lessons, the children will be learning about which stories are special and why.

Our lessons will focus on the following areas and stories:

- The Bible and the Quran and why they are special books for Christians and Muslims
 - Noah's Ark
 - The Good Samaritan
 - The boy who threw stones at trees
 - Jesus and the Ten Lepers

Reminders:
