Learning at School

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) begins at birth and continues until the end of Reception. During this time, children learn such a lot both at home and school. Our curriculum at school is split into prime areas and specific areas. Children need to progress through the prime areas first to allow them to make progress in the specific areas.



The EYFS curriculum is based on the idea that children learn best through play and the staff at school spend time playing and talking with the children as well as planning activities that are aimed to develop certain skills.

We understand that children have different experiences and starting points but know that every child is entitled to a curriculum that takes these into account and allows them to make progress at their own rate.



Learning at Home

We know that starting school is a big thing for your child and it will help them if they know what to expect.



Talk – Talk about anything! Children learn so much from being talked to. Encourage them to talk to you too. It is such an important skill to be able to hold a conversation by listening and responding.

Read stories – in any language. Talk about the pictures – what can they see? What is happening? Can they retell the story by looking at the pictures? Choose a quiet place – maybe at bedtime – and enjoy some quality time with them.



Encourage independence - The staff at school are always there to help children with whatever they need support with, but a child will often feel more confident when they are able to simple tasks independently. These tasks might include putting their coat on, feeding themselves, getting dressed, or going to the toilet.

Encourage them to put things away – In a busy classroom, it is important that all children help to tidy the toys and equipment away. At home you can make this a game – how quickly can you put your toys away? Can you do it before I count to 20? Could you do it quicker than last time?



What your child will need

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities

All children make progress at different rates, but some children need a little support to help them access the curriculum. Our Special Educational Needs Co-Ordinator (SENCo) is Mrs V Bradbury and she is based at the main school site. If a child is identified as having additional needs, Mrs Bradbury will help us to ensure that they get the right support to help them make progress.

Child Protection

We know that children have bumps and accidents at home as well as at school. We will let you know if we are aware of any injury / accidents that happen at school. However, we will talk to you if we notice any unexplained marks on your child or if they tell us that something has upset or worried them at home. Usually there is a simple explanation, but we might need to check with you.

Mobile Apps



ClassDojo – When you sign up to class dojo, you will receive updates and reminders about events that are taking place in school. You will be able to contact us if you need to and, if you consent to your child's photo appearing on ClassDojo, you will be able to see photos of them accessing their learning at school.



Arbor – From September 2025 all payments to school will be made through Arbor. When your child starts at school, you will be able to download the app. Children starting in the Nursery class will also be able to pay for their school dinners through the app too. You will receive messages from the school through the App. Please allow notification Pop up.
