## Morning Playtime

All children will have a morning break and are encouraged to bring in a bottle of water.

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, they are offered a free piece of fruit.  
KS2 are encouraged to bring in a piece of fruit.

## Lunchtime

---



A healthy school meal is available for all children. The cost is currently **£3.60 per day or £18.00 per week**, this is to be paid online through the Arbor app.



We are strictly a **NUT FREE SCHOOL**- items stating 'may contain nuts' will be allowed in school

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a Universal Free School Meal.  
If your child does not want a school meal, they can bring in a packed lunch in a named lunch box. Please do not send in fizzy drinks.



If you receive income support, job-seekers allowance or in some cases child tax credit or universal credit, your child may be entitled to a Free School Meal. Please ask at the school office for more information.

## After School Clubs

Children are invited to join the various after-school clubs.

Information will be sent out at the beginning of each term.

Your child could enjoy clubs like science club, football, Lego, choir or drama!

We offer before and after school care club that can be booked via the Arbor app.

## Swimming

Swimming is a life skill that every child needs. Children start swimming lessons in Year 4 and then continue in Year 5 and Year 6.

Our lessons take place at Fenton Manor Swimming Baths.

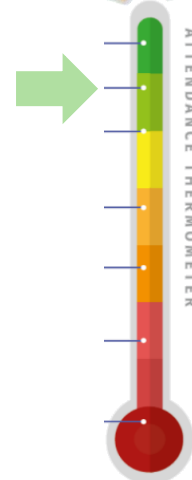
## Let's Celebrate

# Our Curriculum

---

At St Mark's Primary School, we teach all aspects of the National Curriculum.

We enhance the curriculum through planning a visit or visitor each half term. Parents are asked to make a small financial contribution to the cost of the trip. Please see the school website for further information about the curriculum.



## Religious Education

Religious Education is a compulsory part of our school curriculum. All pupils receive one lesson of R.E. each week and each day includes a short act of collective worship. As St Mark's is a Church of England School, the basis of lessons and worship is predominantly Christian and worship is sometimes Anglican (Church of England).

Any parent has the right to ask for their child to be excused from worship, but before exercising that right, parents are asked to discuss with the Headteacher the full implications of withdrawal from this most important area of the curriculum.
